Jim Von Behren '80 Supports Beta Chi

Jim Von Behren '80 is positive that if he had not joined Kappa Sigma he might have quit school. "I enjoyed the friendships and camaraderie from Beta-Chi immensely and I couldn't wait for the fall semester to start. My friendships with my pledge brothers and members always motivated me to come back." Jim's friend from high school and Beta-Chi member **Russell Brazeal '75** suggested Jim check out Kappa Sigma when he first visited the university. "I was instantly very comfortable at Kappa Sigma. I knew it was the place for me."

Membership at Kappa Sigma drove Jim to get his education in engineering and become more responsible. "Kappa Sigma taught us when we were younger members how to be responsible for ourselves and the Chapter House. Then I began to understand how important it was to have the experience of running and operating the Chapter House. The Fraternity is a business and it depended upon its members to keep it running." This understanding led to Jim's election as treasurer and president, two influential leadership experiences for him.

After Jim completed his degree in metallurgical engineering, he felt it was important to advance and diversify his education. "I knew plenty about engineering but didn't have any experience outside of that field. I felt an MBA would complement my engineering experience and make me a more valuable asset to a company and my own career."

Jim spent 14 years in the steel business doing mostly product failure analysis. After receiving his MBA he began his own waste paper and plastic recovery company, Greenway Recycling Inc. Jim enjoys his job because he likes making and working deals with other companies. "I feel more in control of my life and destiny than I did working for someone. Now I am a money maker; I generate business daily, instead of just earning a wage."

Jim feels giving back to Beta-Chi is an easy decision. "I just had to think about all of the good things that the Chapter has done for me and if I want that to continue for other young men to experience. I owe a lot of my success to Beta-Chi; it motivated me to come back every semester and finish school. Being a Chapter officer taught me lessons in life I might not have learned if I weren't a Kappa Sigma. The Fraternity is a positive influence and excellent network.
