Over the last year the House Corporation members evaluated our systems and relationship with the under-

graduate Chapter. We have thoroughly reviewed our financial situation, condition of our house, systems, and processes for managing Kappa Sigma and the House Corporation. We evaluated some of the most successful chapters across the country, interviewing house corporation presidents from California to Mizzou. They were generous enough to share their operations, and we are excited about what we found and the changes we are making that will take Kappa Sigma into the next century.

When looking at the condition of our own Chapter House, it is apparent that significant upgrades are needed. Our 18,000square-foot house is 40 years old, dated, and has MEP systems that are worn out. Our room layout does not meet current student needs. Our group showers are not desirable and scare away potential members. Our life safety systems need updating. The

House Corporation is assessing the future to address these issues and is dedicated to providing a housing plan and facility that matches the quality of our undergraduate Chapter.

However, having quality housing is just one step in the process. A comprehensive facility management plan should complement any potential investment in housing. We have recently implemented new systems and completely changed the relationship between the House Corporation and the undergraduates. These systems are strongly encouraged by Kappa

In addition, we sent Kappa Sigma apparel to a Brother who is serving in Iraq. Perhaps the best example of our fellowship is our success in Greek Week. In the last five years we garnered first place finishes twice and finishing runner-up the other three years.

#### Leadership

Our members hold leadership positions in numerous campus organizations, including multiple professional societies, the campus radio station, Interfraternity Council, and Engineers without Borders.

#### Service

Beta-Chi contributes hundreds of hours to the freshman orientation program, honor societies, and prospective student activities. We adopted a highway near the house and clean up trash on a regular basis and maintain trails at a local park. Our largest service event is our annual fish fry. We have raised more than \$5,000 for local and national charities, includ-
