

BETA-CHI BROTHERS ISSUE \$150,000 MATCHING GIFT CHALLENGE Step Up Now and Help Reach Our Goal

Three 1958 alumni issued a \$150,000 matching gift challenge to their Kappa Sig Brothers to spark new and increased giving and to bring us closer to our *Securing the Future for the Beta-Chi Chapter of Kappa Sigma* campaign goal. These generous donors, who have all made prior pledges to the campaign, are stepping forward once again. They will match every new dollar donated to the campaign—up to \$150,000—between now and **October 8, 2011**. The campaign stands to gain \$300,000 (\$150,000 in new gifts matched by \$150,000 from the challenge donors).


Hall of Fame Banquet

Alumnus' Contributions Remembered and Revered Donor Testimonial—Ted Ruppert '49



Brother Ted Ruppert '49 has given his resources wisely. Whether it is his natural leadership skills as an undergraduate with the Beta-Chi Chapter or advising students through their education. his work has left its mark in his Fraternity, his community, and the lives of many. Ted was initiated into Beta-Chi in 1949 where he served many official offices, including guard, grand treasurer, and grand master. He somehow made time to take part in intramural sports, the Petroleum Club, Theta Tau, and Interfraternity Council.

Ted graduated from MSM in 1953 and went to work for Texaco for three months but was called to action in the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, where he served for two training cycles as a company commander. He was sent to Korea and assigned to a company responsible for rebuilding the infrastructure for Seoul, Korea, to the North Korean border. After several weeks he was promoted to commanding officer of his group because he was the only one with an engineering background, thanks to his days at MSM.

After finishing his tour with the Army, Ted returned to work at Texaco in the marshes of Louisiana. There, he served as a field engineer and was assigned the daunting task of creating the most efficient process for extracting the most fuel. Texaco then looked to him to utilize his knowledge in chemistry to develop a drilling fluid that would not turn to a solid when used in depths of around 20,000 feet. To this day they still use the fluid that he developed.

From there his talents were sought by Chase Manhattan Bank, where he was hired as an engineer-banker in the petroleum department. After two years he was promoted to vice president and banking-engineer of his division.

In 1969, he took over a group of jointly owned investments his father made, which had grown to the level that they required someone to manage them personally. This led him back to St. Louis, Missouri, where he merged their company with a New York company, creating Varlen Corporation, which was taken public. Ted served as director and, after adding several other successful ventures to his portfolio, was able to reflect on his 40 years of experience in the field, which led him to the revelation of the need for a highly educated younger generation. Since 1970, he's been allocating personal funds to help financially deprived students receive a college education. He chose to do this without help from any institution because he felt that personal supervision would prove most successful.

Now, because of the immense work involved in supervising his cause, he's joining efforts with MS&T and Kappa Sigma. Ted's financial commitment to the a campaign comes from his desire to keep the Chapter House "permanently cleaned up" due to his personal belief in cleanliness.

Ted has served on the house committee and he's not the only Ruppert who was a Beta-Chi. His brother, Robert, was initiated in 1950 and passed away in 1998. Despite the immense efforts he's made throughout his life, Ted would only like to continue and move on anonymously. However, when someone does so many great things, his contributions are remembered and revered.
