


BETA-CHI CELEBRATES 113 YEARS ON CAMPUS DURING HOMECOMING



ALUMNUS THANKFUL FOR KAPPA SIGMA LIFE LESSONS

J.C. GRIESE '72 STAYS CONNECTED TO BETA-CHI



When **J.C. Griesel '72** joined Kappa Sigma, the Chapter House was brand new. While the exterior of the Chapter may have enticed him, the men who lived there was what truly attracted his attention. "I have to say it was the character and personality of Beta-Chi," J.C. says. "There you had an organization that embraced a diverse set of personalities, was an unpretentious environment, and a place that encouraged you to be yourself."

As an undergraduate, he and his Brothers learned the value of tolerance. "My pledge class was a bizarre assortment of personalities and we had no choice but to work together," J.C. says. "This tolerance quickly grew into teamwork, then mutual respect, and ultimately, brotherly love and lifelong friendships." He is thankful to stay connected to his Kappa Sigma Brothers over the past 40 years. Every five years or so, their pledge class gets together "for a beer or 12." Most recently, they traveled to Tulum, Mexico, for a week, and when he's in St. Louis during Christmas season, he enjoys the evening get-together at Llywelyn's Pub.

J.C. recently retired from Michelin North America where he had a 37-year career. The first half of his career was spent in various engineering, technical, and management roles. In the second half, he transitioned into

marketing and sales, where he held three different director-level positions. Simultaneously, he pursued a 31-year military career in the Army National Guard, retiring in 2008 at the rank of colonel.

Throughout his career, his most enjoyable job was as director of Michelin's mining tires business unit. This was immediately followed by what became his most rewarding one: serving as a field artillery brigade commander in Iraq when his unit was activated and assigned to Baghdad in 2006-2007 during the surge. "What made it so rewarding was simply the privilege of serving with these splendid young American soldiers as they went about the serious business of combat operations," J.C. says. "After that experience, any professional activities or responsibilities pale in comparison."

Some may say that Kappa Sigma was the best years of their life—he respectfully disagrees. "I really enjoyed my college years, but so much good has happened in my life since graduation," J.C. says. "I've been blessed. I would say that my early association with Kappa Sigma enabled the best years of my life. Many life lessons about tolerance, teamwork, and leadership have made all the difference for me, both professionally and personally."
