Beta-Chi Brothers and Alumni Set the Standard

Finally ... things are back to normal: no masks, indoor gatherings are allowed, and we even participated in the annual campus St. Pat's celebration. With life returning to how we once knew it, Kappa Sigma hosted one of the largest events of the weekend, and fun was had by all.

Every year, the university provides Kappa Sigma a list of members who need financial assistance based on their financial aid score. Last semester, the Beta Chi Educational Foundation provided 15 individuals with a \$1,500 scholarship for financial need, three individuals with a \$1,000 scholarship based on ACT scores, and four individuals with a \$1,000 recruitment scholarship. We were able to get \$5,000 in matching funds from Missouri S&T as well.

I want to thank each of you for your generous support of our undergraduate members, as these funds come from alumni donations. He came to Kappa Sigma from Kirkwood, Missouri, majored in mechanical engineering, played and lettered four years in football, and served the Chapter as an officer and St. Pat's Board representative. Recently, Jerry's diligence and organizational skills brought the pledge class together to celebrate our 50th Beta-Chi anniversary. Brothers and wives enjoyed a weekend in Naples, Florida, filled with fun, memories, and renewal of brotherhood. Conversations picked up, without pause, where they left off many years ago.

Jerry's pledge/initiation project was the gateway wall, which still identifies our Beta-Chi Chapter House at 1701 White Columns Drive. "Kiel's Wall" at the entrance drive

to our house proudly presents the Kappa Sigma Greek letters to the UMR/MS&T campus as well as the city of Rolla. Jerry built the wall as his gift to the Fraternity. Our pledge class walkout to Jerry's family's Lake of the Ozark house will never be forgotten.

The Brothers also fondly remember his wife, Carol, at all of the social functions that the demanding academic schedule allowed. Jerry is survived by Carol, son Josh, and daughter Courtney. The pledge class of 1969 has made a group donation to the Beta-Chi Educational Foundation in Jerry's memory.

Richard T. Bradley, P.E. '84 Appreciates His Sigma Kappa Experience

Studying engineering is no small feat; it requires hard work and an attention to detail. With all the stress it brings, it is an important to have a place to escape. To **Rich Bradley '84**, that place was the Sigma Kappa brotherhood.

"Beta-Chi was a place where you lived, studied, laughed, and found comfort coping with all the pressures of school and life," Rich said. "We worked hard and played hard."

Growing up, Rich visited the Beta-Chi house to see his brother, **Edward Bradley Jr., P.E. '81**. Ed pledged Kappa Sigma with the recommendation of their family friend, **Andy Tayon '77**, and thoroughly enjoyed his experience. When it was Rich's turn to join a fraternity, he knew that Kappa Sigma was the best place for him.

"It was the first place I had ever lived on my own," Rich said. "The brotherhood and friendships created during my undergraduate days are lifelong, and the stories of those days will be with me forever."

Some of those stories include his pledge class walkout to Bass Canoe in Steelville, Missouri, becoming a Student Knight at St. Pat's, and serving as Grand Master.

As an alumnus, a Kappa Sigma memory that stands out to him is his induction to the 2009 Beta-Chi Hall of Fame. "When you look at all the names of the Brothers who have been inducted into the HOF over the years, it is very humbling," he shared. "It's always great to get back to the house and chat with the guys about school and the Chapter. It's also great to be recognized with such a great HOF Class!"

Rich is the president of the City of St. Louis Board of Public Service. He is responsible for all planning, design, and construction of public works projects as well as the Equipment Services and Facilities Management



Divisions, the Office of Special Events, the management of the Soldiers Memorial, and the board secretary's office.

"You quickly learn that you are on call 24/7 and that you never really have any time off," Rich said. "You have to always be ready and willing to do whatever it takes to get the job done quickly and efficiently! I have an outstanding staff and always enjoy figuring out creative ways to solve the never-ending list of problems that arise daily."

Rich has many proud moments in his career, including being a 34-year city employee as well as being a registered professional engineer in Missouri and Illinois. He is the 17th president of the BPS and was the youngest ever appointed. He is also the second-longest tenured BPS president, with four

appointments serving three mayors.

Rich remains connected to his Kappa Sigma Brothers; he talks to many members through various professional and volunteer organizations as well as in his job. "It's not surprising that it really is a small world when it comes to Kappa Sigma," he said. "In fact, my brother Ed, **Steve Ederle '84**, and **Mike Smith '78** were all in my wedding many years ago!"

Rich has been married to his wife, Alison, for more than 26 years. Alison is a BSN-RN and takes care of all the students at St. Louis University. They have a daughter, Kristin, who is a Gamma Phi Beta and recent Loyola University New Orleans graduate. With her degree in music therapy, she is working on becoming a physician assistant. The family also has two dogs, Harper and Tuck.
